

There are a number of different constraints on the site that need to be considered for any development on site. Large sewers with easements traverse the site and redundant mine shafts are located on the northern end of the site. The southern end of the site is located with in the Warmley Conservation Area.

This initial assessment looks at locating any residential development to the North of the site

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outside the conservation area and is predominantly flat. The southern end of the site is suitable for the reinstatement of grass sports pitches due to the plateauing of the site.

The centre of the site, in which the school and artificial turf pitch (ATP) was located, could be used for both sports provision and residential development, subject to the size of sports pitch to be provided.
